Ionut and his wife, Andreea, both in their 20s, live in Beius, Romania. They met at a vocation camp for mute people. They have been married three years and have two children. With no home of their own, Ionut and Andreea have been moving between shelters and temporary accomodation with damp walls, cold rooms and no proper kitchen or shower.

With the help from Habitat for Humanity Romania and international volunteers who travel to Beius this Easter, they are building a home of their own. Home-building around Easter is a tradition that started in Romania 11 years ago. Each year, volunteers and families who need homes come together for a week to build. At the end of this great week, families move into their new homes.

You do not have to be with us to build with us. Even a small amount can still help Ionut and Andreea finish their construction at the end of this week. Help them build this Easter home!
