


















India Overview

➤ Urban India has grown from 26 million people in 1991 to 285 million people in 2001. It is expected that by 2020 the urban population in the country would be 40 per cent of the total population.

According to NHB's projections, the shortage of housing units in India is expected to shoot up to 80 million units between '07 and '12.





Challenges to Producing Affordable Housing

- The inability of the potential buyer in the segment to access loans
- High Land costs in Strategic locations
- Rising Construction costs
- Bureaucratic delays can add to costs
- Dominated by unorganised players
- Lack of mandatory specifications





SCHEMATIC LAYOUT OPTION 2a LIG HOUSING- NALASOPARA PLOT NO. 238















