Habitat Youth Build - the largest volunteer build event

This year's event in Asia peaked on April 27 with 14,000 volunteers at simultaneous builds across 42 sites in seven countries. Habitat Youth BUILD 2013 has resulted in more than 600 families securing decent housing. The efforts of tens of thousands of volunteers, both onsite and online, were vital to the campaign.
