



#### Habitat's structure





### Microfinance & housing support services

- Accelerate incremental building
- Partner with lenders to direct small loans
- Provide technical support to ensure sustainability

Microloans build houses stronger and faster—and more of them



### Disaster risk reduction & response

- Teach communities to build stronger
- Advocate governments to prioritize risk reduction
- Provide emergency shelter, cleaning, new construction

Stronger shelters will withstand the next storm



### Water, sanitation, & health

- Build infrastructure and filters for clean water
- Build latrines for disease reduction—and dignity
- Build kitchens and smokeless stoves to reduce illness
- Provide health education along with tools

A decent place to live means more than a roof and walls—it's livability



### Vulnerable groups

- Serve families who have little to no income
  - Children orphaned during the HIV/AIDS crisis in Malawi
  - Families treated for leprosy in Ethiopia
  - People experiencing homelessness in Hungary
  - Families with disabled children in Chile
