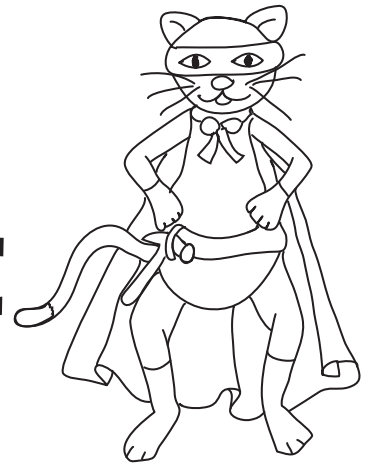


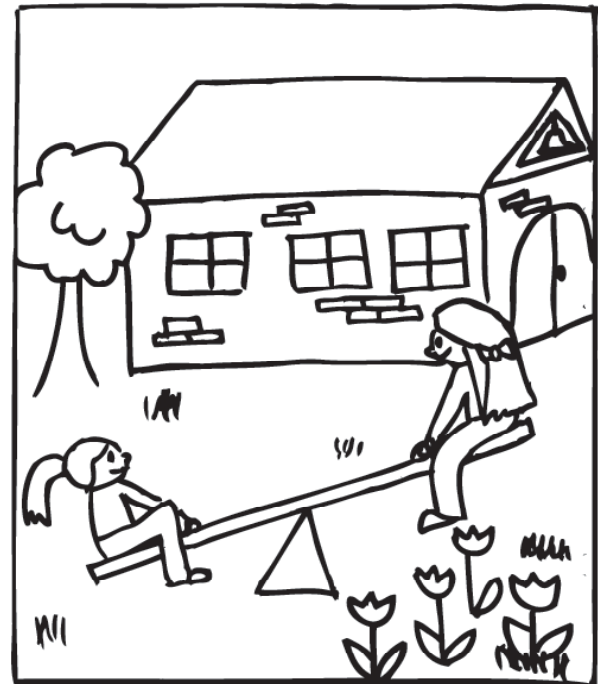

# The Adventures of **Habicat**

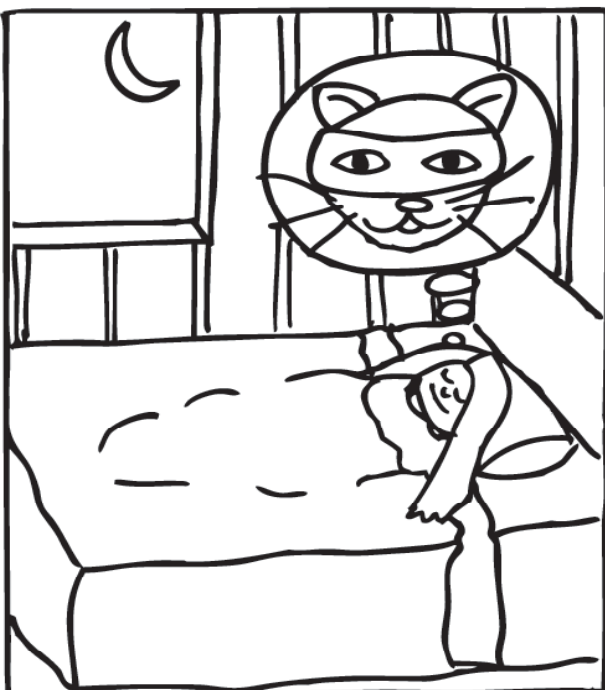


Julie was sitting in class one day when her teacher asked them to answer the question, "What is a home?"

At recess, Kristen told Julie that a home was a building made of bricks or wood with a roof on top.

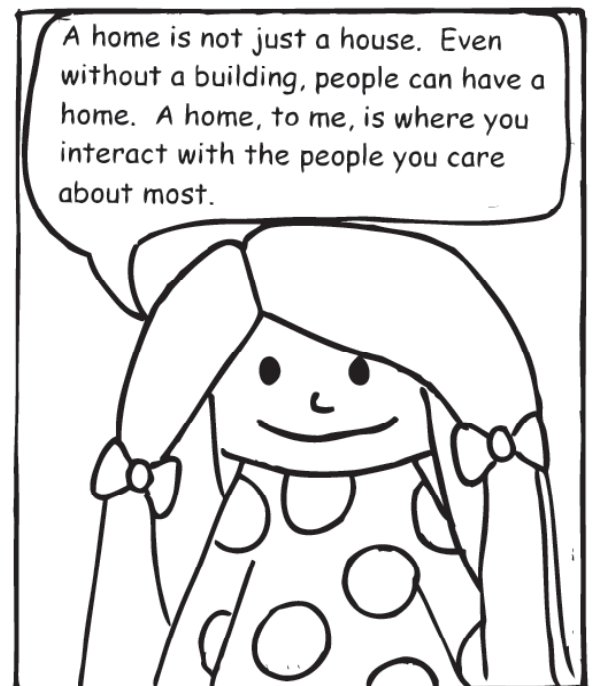


A home is not just a house. Even without a building, people can have a home. A home, to me, is where you interact with the people you care about most.
