The housing need in El Salvador

El Salvador is the smallest and most populated country in Central America, with a population of approximately 6.5 million people. Eight of every 10 Salvadorians live in inadequate conditions (INCAE-HPHI, 2016) and 3 of every 10 families live in extreme poverty (PNUD, 2015). Many of these families do not have access to sanitation, drinking water, education, funding to improve their homes, land tenure, or the opportunity of living in a safe, healthy and stable place.

El Salvador is one of the most vulnerable countries in the world, in face of threats such as earthquakes, volcanic eruptions, floods and tropical storms. In January of 2001, two earthquakes affected El Salvador, one month apart; they caused destruction and human losses. Risks of natural disasters, along with migration, and a slow economic and social growth pose a challenge for the country's sustainable development.

Habitat's contribution in El Salvador

Persons or communities that need help to build or improve their houses seek help from Habitat for Humanity El Salvador to achieve such goal. Families build their houses along with volunteers and donors. In addition, they pay a loan with accessible installments and terms according to their possibilities. Families now live with the self-reliance and stability they need to build a better future. Habitat El Salvador has worked together with Salvadorans for more than 26 years through housing, community, risk management and financial education projects, among others.

Building homes and communities

Habitat El Salvador builds affordable homes and enables improvements, based on each family's needs. Further, each project is carried out under national and international construction standards. There is a catalogue with house designs and three funding modalities: Credit, Credit-Subsidy and Subsidy. These last two modalities are supported by national and international donors.

Community projects

Community projects aim at strengthening comprehensive development and expand our work with the help of local and international volunteers, partners and allies, to create long-term impact on families and communities. The projects allow for comprehensive community progress, income generation, health, education and basic infrastructure. These efforts support community development, turning them into safe, decent and lively places for current and future neighbors.

Risk management

Risk Management and Disaster Response assistance and education is provided. We support families and communities during natural disaster preparation, mitigation, response and reconstruction stages. Habitat El Salvador is founding member of the Humanitarian Country Team, formed by a group of organizations that get organized in case of an emergency.

Housing access services

Habitat El Salvador gives training in financial education, construction, risk management and community development. Strengthening these abilities and knowledge enables building a solid foundation for long-term success.
