

The housing need in India

The Directive Principles of State Policy in India advocate for the state to ensure various rights, including a decent standard of living for all. This objective necessitates the provision of adequate housing, without which the goal cannot be attained. The 2019 OECD survey of the Indian economy identified a high percentage of individuals living in poor quality housing compared to other emerging market economies. Moreover, the existing shortage of 10 million urban housing units primarily affects the lower-income group segment. The 2019 RICS-Knight Frank report suggests that due to increasing urbanization, an additional 25 million homes will be required by 2030.



How Habitat addresses the need

Decent and affordable homes

In India, since 1983, Habitat for Humanity has helped more than 622,000 people build or improve a place they can call home. We also provide basic services, such as improved sanitation units, and help people recover and rebuild their homes and lives following natural disasters.

Inclusive housing markets through innovation

In India, Habitat's Terwilliger Center for Innovation in Shelter continues its research and sector engagement in manufactured sand, roofing products, and roofing and housing finance. Areas of focus include sustainability in construction and climate-adaptative solutions, such as heat-reflective coatings. The Terwilliger Center and its partners have supported six startups through Habitat's ShelterTech platform for innovative housing solutions.

Golf for Humanity

Following Habitat for Humanity's fruitful partnership with the Asian Tour as their official Sustainable Development Partner in 2018, Habitat India has been organizing an annual Charity Golf Tournament to raise awareness, mobilize support and bring the need for decent housing closer to the hearts of the golfing community. Disaster response and preparedness

Habitat India has been responding to disasters with large-scale and long-term rebuilding projects since 1999. A year after devastating floods hit Kerala state in August 2018, Habitat India helped over 156,000 families through humanitarian aid kits, conditional cash transfers, transitional and core shelters, livelihood skills training, and others.

Volunteer engagement

Over 10 million supporters have participated in the Habitat Young Leaders Build, helping to raise awareness, funds, and advocate for affordable housing. Even during the COVID-19 pandemic, volunteers supported Habitat India's online crowdfunding and fundraising events.
